17	1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) brings this Statement of Issues solely in her official			
18	capacity as the Interim Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of			
19	Consumer Affairs.			
20	2. On or about January 7, 2019, the Board received an application for a Pharmacy			
21	Technician Registration from Rebecca Castillo (Respondent). On or about January 2, 2019,			
22	Respondent certified under penalty of perjury to the truthfulness of all statements, answers, and			
23	representations in the application. The Board denied the application on August 27, 2019.			
24	JURISDICTION			
25	3. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Board under the authority of the			
26	following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless			
27	otherwise indicated.			
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4. Code section 4300 (c) states:

The board may refuse a license to any applicant guilty of unprofessional conduct. The board may, in its sole discretion, issue a probationary license to any applicant for a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct and who has met all other requirements for licensure.

## STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS

- 5. Code section 480 states, in pertinent part:
- (a) A board may deny a license regulated by this code on the grounds that the applicant has one of the following:

. . .

(3)(A) Done any act that if done by a licentiate of the business or profession in question, would be grounds for suspension or revocation of license.

. .

6. Code section 4301 states, in pertinent part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.

. . .

7. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare.

- 8. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1769, states, in pertinent part:
- (a) In addition to any other requirements for licensure, when considering the approval of an application, the board or its designee may require an applicant to be examined by one or more physicians and surgeons or psychologists designated by the board if it appears that the applicant may be unable to safely practice due to mental illness or physical illness affecting competency. An applicant's failure to comply with the examination requirement shall render his or her application incomplete. The board shall pay the full cost of such examination. The board shall seek that the evaluation be conducted within 60 days of the date the applicant is advised that an examination is required. The board shall receive the examiner's evaluation within 60 days of the date the examination is completed. The report of the examiner shall be made available to the applicant.

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## SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION 1 (Mental or Physical Illness Affecting Competency) 2 11. Respondent's application is subject to denial under California Code of Regulations, 3 title 16, section 1769, in that Respondent is unable to safely practice as a pharmacy technician. 4 5 The circumstances are as follows: On or about May 15 and June 13, 2019, at the direction of the Board, Respondent 12. 6 submitted to a psychological evaluation. On or about June 16, 2019, the evaluator issued a report 7 which concluded that Respondent is unsafe to practice as a pharmacy technician unless she 8 9 engages in psychotherapeutic treatment and participates in a 12-step program. 10 **PRAYER** WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, 11 and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision: 12 1. Denying the application of Rebecca Castillo for a Pharmacy Technician Registration 13 14 Applicant; 2.
